Cemetery Sunday - Sunday 24th May 2009
Laurencetown 2.30pm & Chare 4.00pm

The ceremony begins **inside the church** with readings, homily and Benediction. After Benediction the Rosary will be recited and prayers recited for the deceased. You will then be invited to process to the graves for the blessing. The whole ceremony will be relayed through the outside speaker systems at our churches and cemeteries for the benefit of those who do not come inside the church.

We ask that you bring a bottle of water with you which will be blessed after the recitation of the Rosary and then members of your family may, at the appropriate time, sprinkle your family grave with the holy water.

To help our parish meet the increasing costs of the care and maintenance of our cemeteries, parishioners and visitors are asked to be generous to the Cemetery Collection. This year the graves of the Parish are in the process of being restored. In preparation for Cemetery Sunday relatives and visitors to our cemeteries are asked to help maintain the sacred character of our cemeteries by ensuring that all rubbish and discarded wreaths are put into the skips or taken away for disposal. To have discarded wreaths at the end of paths or on open spaces spoils the appearance of our cemeteries and increases the maintenance costs.

The Traditional May Altar
Like the May devotions themselves, the custom of the May Altar stems from southern European countries. A report from France in 1842 speaks of Our Lady's Altar in May showing off in rich splendour, while the families also erected and decorated small house altars. "All of nature, awakened to new life in springtime, is presented to honor Mary, who has been 'in use of flowers, a My of the valleys' (Song of Songs 2, 2)."

To make a traditional May altar place a statue of Our Lady in your living room and make a little shrine. Place the statue on a pretty cloth and then decorate with flowers - carnations, primroses, the white mayflower and other wild flowers are traditional.
